Warsaw, 30 November–1 December 2018

Slavic languages form one of the largest branches of the Indo-European family. They are represented not only by strong state languages with well established social prestige and legal support, but also small, vulnerable idioms with disputed status and uncertain future. Many of those were formed in border areas as a result of linguistic contact with non-Slavic ethnic groups and their cultures. Others descend from isolated varieties which have developed new traits unknown in other languages or – on the contrary – retain archaic features fascinating for the researchers.

Linguistic minorities of the Slavic area are the theme of the conference to be held at the turn of November and December 2018. We would like to invite linguists, social and cultural anthropologists, historians and all scholars interested in language and its relations with culture and identity. We expect not only papers concerning Slavic languages in the strict sense, but also studies of non-Slavic groups whose history was influenced by their Slavic neighbours.



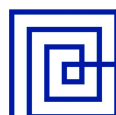
